Registration

Registering early is strongly encouraged for two reasons. First, some classes have very limited space and will close early. If a class you've chosen is closed when you register, your name (dated and time stamped) will be put on a waiting list. Students are introduced to well-known composers of all genres and time periods. Each class begins with a famous work by our "Composer of the Month" and the students move to the music using scarves or ribbon streamers. Elements of music are discussed such as fast/slow, loud/ soft, smooth/choppy, mood, etc. Each week a different instrument of the orchestra is studied and demonstrated (through video). All four instrument families of the orchestra are covered throughout the year. Other concepts taught are:

- Beat/no beat
- Moving and playing to a steady beat
- Body percussion
- Identifying and using classroom instruments (sticks, shakers, scrapers, drums, etc.) Quarter notes, eighth notes and quarter rest
- Reading rhythms using Kodaly Method (ta, ti-ti, shh)
- Echoing solfège patterns (mi, so, la)

Let's begin singing! These are our youngest singers in the Nashville Notes sequence of choirs. They spend time finding their beautiful singing voices, how to feel and create a steady beat, and how to move expressively to recorded masterworks. Occasionally, they play simple percussion instruments and may be accompanied by piano or guitar. The Grace Notes Choir performs in a Christmas and spring concert.

All Grace Notes Choir students are encouraged to take the corresponding Music Foundations class for a complete music education experience.

Class Limit: 18 students

Students continue studying composers, building on the foundation started in GMF, as well as the instrument families. A few new instruments are introduced that are not as commonly seen. New concepts taught are:

- Naming and identifying woodwind, brass, percussion and string families by sight and sound
- Identifying form in music: AB, ABA, rondo
- Dynamics and Dynamics Vocabulary
- Tempo and Tempo Vocabulary
- Treble Staff
- Playing rhythm patterns that include quarter, eighth, half and whole notes and quarter, half and whole rests
- Echoing solfège patterns including so, la, do re mi so la do'

Let's keep it going! Praise Station is a wonderful place to continue learning about music through group singing. Students learn good singing habits and develop confidence through exposure to a wide variety of choral literature, singing games and musical styles. Additionally, they are expanding their aural skills with simple part-singing. Praise Station choir performs in a Christmas and spring concert.

All Praise Station Choir students are encouraged to take the corresponding Music Foundations class for a complete music education experience.

Class Limit: 20 students

The purpose of this class is to prepare the students for playing or singing in a higher level ensemble. Students will continue to build on all concepts learned in GMF. New concepts introduced are:

- Time signatures
- Sixteenth notes
- Syncopated rhythms
- Dotted notes
- Musical Alphabet (reading music)
- Ostinato, crescendo, decrescendo, staccato, legato and accent

Students will practice all of these concepts on classroom instruments including bucket drums and recorders. Students will possibly perform as a "Recorder Ensemble" at the Christmas and Spring Concerts.

The Bridge Choir continues building singing, rhythm and aural skills. Choral repertoire incorporates more rounds, partner songs and two-part harmony; we may also include foreign languages. Students will be introduced to reading choral octavos in class at a very basic level. Some lyric learning at home will be necessary in preparation for choral presentations. The Bridge Choir performs in the Christmas and spring concerts.

- a weekly 20 minute enrichment class to help students achieve a clear understanding of basic music theory.

Singing 2, 3 and 4-part music, students continue learning and practicing healthy vocal technique and singing posture. Choristers learn about the changing voice and explore new ways of using their voices as they go through vocal transition. "Movable Do" solfeggio is used in order to build sight-reading skills and a strong emphasis on the development of listening skills essential for a high quality ensemble sound. We sing a variety of music styles in English as well as world music selections in other languages.

At this level students are expected to practice at home between rehearsals, logging their practice time daily into their notebooks, and weekly into Charms via the blue app or on computer. Daily vocalizing is expected of JH members; each singer's dedication to regular practice will strengthen individual vocal performance and thus improve the choir's sound. JH performs at the Christmas and Spring Concerts.

Some Highlights

- New to a band instrument? (woodwinds, brass, or percussion) Or a strings instrument? (violin, viola, cello, double bass). Check out information about Beginner Band Camp and Beginner Strings Camp in June on pages 14 and 20, a proven method for getting a successful start – highly educational AND fun!! We look forward to having you join Novice Band or Prelude Strings!
- Have you been playing a band instrument for a couple years or more? You may be ready for Select Band! These musicians spend their time in full rehearsal as well as in sectionals, focused more on their particular instrument technique. This also includes the 20 minute Musicianship & Theory (M&T) class where the fundamentals of music theory are covered.
- String Ensemble is not for beginners. If your student has been playing a string instrument for at least 2-3 years, they may be ready for this ensemble which includes the 20 minute Musicianship & Theory (M&T) class. Check out the audition requirements in the description.
- Don't get hung up on ages for the instrumentalist! While choirs are determined by age due to physical vocal development, instrumental ensembles are not. They are determined by skill levels.

An Important Note About Tuners and Metronomes:

Tuners and metronomes are two of the most important tools in a musician's toolbox. They can be found in several ensembles' "Required Materials" list. These two items are worth some consideration.

They can be purchased as 2 separate tools, or 1 combined tool. Using separate tools allows for the musician to watch the tuner AND keep a metronome clicking. Since keeping a steady tempo AND intonation are both essential to progress, this is an excellent way to go!

These can also be accessed through apps on a mobile device or laptop. The "Tonal Energy Tuner" allows both to be accessed at the same time. (There are other options as well.) However, (and this is the important part to consider!) if the decision is to use an electronic version, consider all the distracting notifications that will flash across the top of the screen and potentially sabotage the musician's best efforts and plans! If using a mobile device is the choice to satisfy these required materials, the student needs to develop the habit of setting it to "airplane mode" during practice time. If this can become a habitual practice, a free or very inexpensive app is a great option!

Band Camp is an important element in preparing to participate in Novice Band. Campers experience focused instrumental and music theory instruction and also get a glimpse of the fun, social and interactive side of playing in an ensemble setting.

A beginning music student's progress will vary depending on many factors - motivation, frequency and quality of practice, quality of instrument, to name a few. After camp, students need a few private, one-on-one lessons to be prepared for Novice Band. Parents can expect an evaluation and consultation with their child's camp instructor to ensure proper preparation for band. Continuing private lessons once enrolled in Novice Band is an excellent choice, but not a requirement.

(Details such as Date, Time, Location, and Cost will be available in February. Camp typically takes place the first week of June.)

Sectionals - Woodwinds, brass, and percussion will separate for focused instruction on their instrument technique and music instruction.

In this ensemble, students begin to systematically build upon the instrument foundations learned at camp and private lessons. They'll be guided towards excellent fundamentals, aimed at laying a solid foundation which can be built on reliably and successfully! Rehearsal time will cover central issues like instrument care and maintenance, embouchure, articulation, successful practice habits, breathing, posture, reading pitches and rhythms, following a conductor, and development of tone. And of course, fun band music! Novice Band performs at Christmas and spring concerts.

This ensemble is comprised of students who have already learned the basic fundamentals of their instrument. Incoming students, new to Novice Band, will be expected to already have some experience and will be evaluated to ensure this ensemble is a good fit.

Recommended minimum age: 10

- Required Materials: instrument, instrument supplies, black or silver music stand, metronome, and tuner.
- Required Band method book: Essential Elements book 1 (instrument specific)
- Minimum Weekly Home Practice Requirements: 2 hrs./wk

***Musicianship & Theory (M&T)** - a weekly 20 minute enrichment class to help students achieve a clear understanding of basic music theory.

Welcome to our Select Band, the next destination for students after meeting the standards covered in Novice Band. In Select Band, students rehearse and perform alongside all the families of instruments - brass, woodwinds, and percussion together in the standard "band" configuration! In this more diverse musical setting, they learn to balance their individual contributions by supporting an exciting, multi-faceted team. Students explore and learn more about what their particular instrument does in an ensemble and the characteristic roles of others. In rehearsal, students are led through the challenges of the music, given focused instruction to practice at home, and encouraged towards personal responsibility and development–all under the watchful eye of our esteemed and experienced conducting staff. All of these efforts culminate in a performance each semester that celebrates the students' hard work and development.

<u>Eligibility:</u> Students will be asked to demonstrate their current level of proficiency by:

- 1. playing 2 major scales of their choice,
- 2. playing a full range of notes by $\frac{1}{2}$ step (chromatically) from the lowest note to the highest note they are able to play.
- 3. Demonstrating their instrument skills by playing music of their choice.

- Required Materials: instrument, instrument supplies, method book, black or silver stand, black 3-ring binder, metronome, and tuner.
- Required Band method book: Sound Innovations: Ensemble Development for Intermediate Concert Band (the green book, instrument specific)
- Minimum Weekly Home Practice: average 3 hrs. per week (6 days for 30 minutes each day. OR 4 days for 45 minutes each day.)

<u>Note to Percussionists</u>: Besides playing in full band with your wind compatriots, you will also have opportunities to develop the many skills needed as a percussionist, developing musicality in all the concert percussion instruments and more – timpani, marimba, vibes, drumset, xylophone, snare, bells, world percussion, etc.

A one-time percussion rental fee of \$50/student will be added to ensemble fees to enable Nashville Notes to keep all percussion instruments in working order, giving each percussion student the best possible experience on these instruments.

In addition to the above required materials, all Select Band percussionists must have:

- 1. 1 pair of Marimba Mallets (yarn, hard)
- 2. 1 pair of Xylophone Mallets (med, rubber)
- 3. 1 pair of Timpani Mallets (med)
- 4. Snare Drum Sticks (concert)
- 5. Stick bag

Jazz Band (JB) 2:30 – 3:30		Director: Roland Barber

This ensemble is designed to guide students in an exploration of jazz through both performance and research of its history, iconic compositions and performers. Students gain familiarity and orientation in the rich history of jazz and its associated subgenres as they study and perform music from the rich library of the jazz tradition, from Louis Armstrong and New Orleans' "Second Line" to Miles Davis and the Birth of the Cool, from big band swing to bebop, Cuban music, R&B and beyond! Our primary focus is on improvisation, as students learn to express themselves according to their imagination and unique musical voice. Students receive tools to train their ears and minds to realize and perform their own creative intentions as they work to cultivate an authentic jazz "voice", which means developing a personal and expressive tone, emphasizing rhythmic feel and timing, and studying transcriptions of great solos. They also study popular song forms, including the 12-bar Blues format, and the 32-bar Great American popular song style. Advanced students can expect to be offered gigs outside of Nashville Notes regular concert programming.

Students should expect to practice for at least two hours a week in this class. By Audition Only. Email <u>r.barber@nashvillenotes.org</u> to schedule an audition. 12:00 - 1:00

Worship band is comprised of instrumentalists and vocalists, beginners to advanced, who are interested in learning about the special aspects of this unique type of ensemble. Students will be given instruction on how to know what to play, working together as a team, getting the right sound from their instrument, as well as training in leading others to participate and Biblical foundations of worship. Class time will be divided between instruction and practical application through participation. Many musical styles of worship will be explored during the semester giving opportunity for a wide variety of instrumentation and vocal participation. Students can expect to learn how to replicate existing songs, how to adapt song arrangements to fit different instrumentation, and how to lead others to participate. Students will participate in smaller ensembles as well as a large group.

Prelude Strings is a beginner orchestra for students ages 7 and up who have been playing violin, viola, cello, or double bass for a minimum of 2 months. We perform levels 1 and 2 works for strings that are designed to guide players through the fundamentals, develop their musicality, and foster ensemble-playimbleng skills. Although this is ensemble is non-auditioned, there is a lot of intricate technique required when learning a stringed instrument, which is difficult to adequately address in a large group setting. Therefore, all students are required to take private lessons for a minimum of 2 months leading up to enrollment, and throughout their participation in Prelude Strings. This ensemble is not a *required* pre-requisite to String Ensemble, though it is a great fit for students that are new to a stringed instrument and need to delve into essential techniques such as proper posture, bowing, finger placement, and intonation – all of which will lay the groundwork for their participation in String Ensemble down the road.

- Minimum Weekly Home Practice: 2 hrs. (20 min./day)

String Ensemble works on string orchestra pieces between levels 2 and 3. There is a lot of intricate technique required when learning a stringed instrument, which is difficult to adequately address in a large group setting. Therefore, **all students are required to take private lessons**. String Ensemble makes an excellent adjunct to lessons once a student reaches level 2 proficiency or higher. Students at this level should be able to tune their own instrument.
